### WHY DO WE HAVE PHYTOSANITARY REGULATIONS?

The current regulations are intended to safeguard the European Union against numerous diseases and parasites harmful to humans, animals and plants.

They apply to all animal or animal-origin foodstuffs, products of animal origin, plant-based foodstuffs, plants and minerals.

### Products of animal origin can carry bacteria that can cause infectious diseases

Due to the risk of introducing these types of disease into the European Union, imports of animal-origin foodstuffs are subject to very strict veterinary checks and procedures.

All animal products that do not comply with these rules must be relinquished on arrival in the EU for official disposal.

Any undeclared products will be confiscated by the customs sevices and destroyed and you will have to pay a fine.

# Plants and plant-based products are possible vectors of contamination

Certain plants and plant-based products (fruits, vegetables, plants, flowers, etc.) are possible vectors of contamination from harmful organisms.

They are therefore subject to a compulsory phytosanitary inspection when they enter the European Union.

There are nevertheless a few exceptions on condition that the imported product meets certain conditions.

Products of animal origin



The following products are BANNED from importation

- Meat
  - Standard meats:
    - beef, chicken, lamb, rabbit, pork, etc.
  - Bushmeat:
    - porcupine, monkey, antelope, snake etc.



- Meat products
  - foie gras
  - pâté
  - terrine
  - kofta meatballs
  - sausage...

- Milk and dairy products
  - milk
  - cream, butter
  - yoghurt...



For all other products of animal origin, such as honey or snails for example, travellers can import up to a maximum of 2kg into the EU



The following products are AUTHORISED for importation based on certain conditions

- Dried or fresh fish
  - Certain crustaceans: prawns, etc.
  - Shellfish: mussels, oysters, etc.

Authorised maximum: 20kg / person

- soil and other substrates
- seeds



# The following products are AUTHORISED for importation based on certain conditions

### ■ Fruits

- apples
- pears, etc.
- Vegetables
  - salads
  - peppers
  - cabbages, etc
- Herbs
  - mint
  - peppers
  - turmeric, etc.
- Certain flowers
  - such as roses.
  - orchids, etc.



- They must meet all of the following conditions
  - be stored in personal luggage
  - be intended for personal consumption
  - not pose a health hazard
  - not be banned from importation

### NB

- Personal luggage is the luggage you present to customs upon arrival.
- It also comprises luggage presented at a later date on condition that the luggage items were checked in at the time of departure by the company you flew with.
- The potential health hazard and risk of spreading harmful organisms varies depending on the country of origin and the type of plant.
