SESAME Water and food security in the Mediterranean: issues and perspectives

150 experts and decision makers from around the Mediterranean will be meeting at Agropolis International in Montpellier, on 21 and 22 February 2013

Global changes – globalisation of economies, sociodemographic trends, degradation of natural resources, climatic change – all give cause for concern about the world's food security.

The G20, under French Presidency, has expressed the need for worldwide thinking on this question, which is at the heart of the issue of global risk. On the occasion of the 6th World Water Forum in Marseille in March 2012, the CGAAER, together with a number of partners and the FAO, prepared a report on water and food security in the face of global change (<u>http://agriculture.gouv.fr/FME-Presentation-EN</u>), ehighlighting the challenges to be addressed as well as numerous examples of solutions.

The situation is particularly worrying in the Mediterranean, a region that combines problems of urban pressure with water scarcity, the overexploitation and degradation of natural resources, rural instability and ecosystems that are vulnerable to climatic change.

The 2007-2008 food crisis must be seen as an early warning, urging the search for solutions at local, national and regional levels, namely to secure and add value to the production base for rain-fed and irrigated agriculture and to ensure the food security of the populations concerned.

Mediterranean countries on the northern, southern and eastern shores not only share common problems and assets, they are also highly interdependent and their destinies are intrinsically linked.

Aims of the event

In this context, and in the continuity of the thinking that began in the framework of G20 and the Wold Water Forum, the Montpellier seminar will focus on the Mediterranean region to foster the emergence of a shared vision.

Expected outcomes

- Creation of a think-tank to feed into public policies
- Publication of a first investigative report

Four working sessions:

- "The Mediterranean situation seen in the perspective of global issues"
- "Field approaches for sustainable management of water resources"
- "The "water and food security issue in various Mediterranean countries: (Algeria, Egypt, Spain, France, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Tunisia, Turkey)? Which priority issues at the national and international levels?"
- "Water and food security in the Mediterranean, what vision for the future?"
